1. PUTTING THE PHONE INTO OPERATION

1.1 Inserting a SIM card





- Remove the battery cover (opening in the bottom left-hand corner).
- 2. Insert the SIM card into the SIM card holder with the gold contacts facing down.

1.2 Inserting and charging the battery







- 1. Insert the battery, making sure that the battery contacts touch the phone's gold contacts.
- 2. Place the battery cover over the battery and click it into place.
- 3. Insert the charging cable into the USB port on the phone and the power plug into a mains outlet.
- Charge the battery for at least 4 hours before the first time you use it. Only use batteries and chargers that are permitted for use with this specific model.

1.3 Turning on the phone

• Press and hold the red skey for at least 2 seconds until the emporia logo appears. It will take a few seconds for the home screen to be displayed.

1.4 Entering a PIN code

Enter the four-digit PIN code for your SIM card when asked to do so and confirm the entry.

You have a maximum of three attempts to enter the correct number. If you enter the wrong number three times in a row, you will only be able to unblock the SIM card with the PUK code. You will find your original PIN code and PUK code in the documents supplied with your SIM card by your network operator.

1.5 Setting the language, time and date

- 1. Use to select a **Language** and then confirm your selection by pressing the green key.
- 2. Set the **Time** and **Date** and then save these settings.

1.6 Saving battery power

After a few seconds of inactivity, the screen will go dark to save battery power. In the event of an incoming call or you pressing any key, the screen will light up again. If the automatic keypad lock is on, the phone will only respond if the green we key or the key is pressed.

2. USING THE PHONE

2.1 Home screen


If your phone is on but not using a function, it will display the home screen. You can return to the home screen any time by pressing the red key several times.




2.2 Menu

The key will display the menu.

The menu is a list that enables you to manage the phone's various functions and adapt the phone to your needs.





- The items available in the menu are Messages, FM Radio,
 Tools, Contacts, Call history and Settings.
- Use the green (key and red key beneath the screen to confirm your selection or to return to the home screen.

2.3 Dual-function keys

Some keys have additional functions if they are pressed and held down for a few seconds:

- 🖼 key: Listen to your voicemail.
- **a** key: Turn the keypad lock on or off in standby mode.
- key: Turn silent mode on or off.
- Torch button: Torch on continuously when the phone is on

2.4 Writing text

You enter text using the keypad.

- To input text, press a number key multiple times (e.g. 2×4 , 1×1 , 3×5 , 3×5 and 3×6 for Hallo)
- Special characters and symbols have been assigned to the various keys, but can differ in some languages.
- Pressing the (a) key allows you to select special characters from a table.
- Use the key to switch between the **abc**, **ABC**, **Abc** and **123** input methods.

3. CALLS

3.1 Accepting, rejecting or ending a call

- To answer: Press the green (key to accept the call.
- To decline or end a call: Press the red key.
- To mute the ringtone temporarily, press the volume control button.
- If the screen has gone dark during a call, press the red key twice.

3.2 Calling someone

- > Dialling a number
 - 1. Enter the phone number you want to dial (incl. the area code) using the keypad.
 - 2. Start the call by pressing the green (key.

> Using the redial function

- 1. When on the home screen, press the green key. Your call history will be displayed.
- 2. Use the arrow keys, and , to select a number.
- 3. Start the call by pressing the green (key.
- To go hands-free during a call, open **Options** and turn on the speaker.

4. MESSAGES (SMS)

Menu items: Write message, Received, Unsent, Sent, Delete messages, Text templates, Send contact via SMS, SMS in Contacts and SMS settings

4.1 Writing and sending a message

- 1. Open Menu ⇒ Messages.
- 2. Select Write message.
- 3. Enter the text using the keypad.
- 4. To specify a recipient for the SMS, open **Options** and select **Send**.
- 5. You can now select a contact from the phone book or type in a phone number using the keypad.

4.2 Reading a message

- 1. When you receive a new message, a symbol, will appear on the home screen.
- 2. Press the green (key for **View** to read the message immediately.
- You can find the text message again later on in Menu ⇒ Messages ⇒ Received.
- 4. To read a message, tap on it.

5. FM RADIO

Menu items in Options: Station list, Manual input, Auto search, Loudspeaker and Back

5.1 Searching for a station

You can set the station using the arrow keys, and . and

5.2 Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the volume of the radio using + and - on the side of the phone.

You cannot change the volume if you are in a menu item on the options list. In this case, close the Options menu first.

5.3 Station list

This list shows all the stations already saved.

5.4 Manual input

If you know the frequency of the station you want, you can enter it here directly.

Press the key for the decimal point.

5.5 Auto search

This function searches for all detectable stations and saves them in the station list together with their frequencies.

6. TOOLS

Menu items: Alarm, Calendar, Calculator, FM Radio and Bluetooth

6.1 Alarm

- 1. Open Set time.
- 2. Enter your desired Alarm time and then Save it.
- 3. The alarm is now activated and will go off at the time you have set every day.
- 4. When the alarm is ringing, you can press the red key to turn it off or the green key to activate the snooze function.
- 5. Select **Off** to deactivate the alarm permanently.

6.2 Bluetooth

- 1. Turn the Bluetooth function **On**.
- Tap on Connect and on Search for new devices.A list of available devices will be displayed.
- 3. Select the device you want to pair the phone with from the list.
- 4. Follow the instructions to pair the devices.
- Devices that have been connected before will be recognised and connected automatically.

7. CONTACTS

Menu items: Search for name, Add contact, Edit contact, Delete, Send contact via SMS, Copy contact, My number, Speed-dial keys, Emergency contacts, Contact settings and SMS in Contacts

7.1 Searching for a contact in the phone book

- When on the home screen, press the phone book key, [®], or open Menu ⇒ Contacts ⇒ Search name.
- 2. Use the arrow keys, and , to scroll through the entries or use the keypad to type the first letter of the contact you are looking for.
- 3. Start the call by pressing the green \bigcirc key.

7.2 Adding a contact

- 1. Open Menu ⇒ Contacts ⇒ Add contact.
- 2. Enter the person's name and the phone number and then **Save** them.
- Always save names and numbers with the international dialling code, e.g. +41 for Switzerland, +43 for Austria and +49 for Germany.

7.3 Saving a speed-dial key

You can assign speed-dial keys to numbers you call often.

- 1. Press one of the speed-dial keys: 💵 or 💵
- Enter a Name and Number or Search for a contact in the phone book.

7.4 Changing or deleting a speed-dial key

- 1. Open Menu ⇒ Contacts ⇒ Speed-dial keys.
- 2. Select a speed-dial key from the list.
- 3. Change or delete its link to a particular contact.

7.5 SMS in Contacts

You can have phone book entries sent to you by text message that will automatically be added to your phone book.

The phone number will automatically be stored in your contacts when you receive an SMS with the following content: #Name#Number#, e.g.: #Martin#+436641234567#

- 1. Open Menu ⇒ Contacts ⇒ SMS in Contacts.
- 2. Select On or Only from contacts.

8. SETTINGS

Menu items: Silent/Sleep mode, Sounds and alerts, Handset volume, Display and lights, Time and date, Language, Call waiting, Call forwarding, Withhold number, Auto keypad lock, Network selection, Voicemail number, Emergency contacts, Emergency button, Security settings, 0000 to enter settings and Master reset

8.1 Sounds and alerts

You can personalise the settings for tones, alerts and vibration or select a set of predefined settings (profile).

> Profile: Silent/Sleep mode

Visual notifications only (torch LED flashes and notifications appear on the screen), no ringtone and no vibration function

> Profile: Meeting/Theatre mode

Visual notifications (torch LED flashes and notifications appear on the screen), device vibrates and no ringtone

> Profile: Maximum/Bus mode

Key tones, SMS tone and vibration function activated, ringtone volume is set on maximum

8.2 Keypad lock

You can use the keypad lock to prevent keys on your phone from being pressed accidentally.

> Manual keypad lock

Press the • key for 2 seconds.

Keypad locked appears on the screen.

The $\widehat{\mathbf{n}}$ symbol on the screen then shows that the keypad is locked.

> Automatic keypad lock

Open the **Settings** menu and then the item **Auto keypad lock**. Now select whether the keypad should be locked automatically after **5 sec.**, **15 sec.**, **30 sec.**, **1 min.** or **5 min.** of inactivity or whether this function should be switched off.

> Unlocking the keypad lock

Press the \mathbb{A}^{\ddagger} key for 2 seconds.

Keypad unlocked will appear on the screen.

The phone will then respond to every press of a key again.

If the keypad lock is activated, the phone will only respond if the green (key or the key is pressed. If any other key is pressed, the screen will remain dark to save energy.

8.3 Call forwarding

Specify whether you want certain calls (All calls, If busy, No answer and/or No signal) to be forwarded to your voicemail or another number.

8.4 Withholding your number

Specify whether you would like your number or just »Private number« to be shown to the recipient when making calls.

8.5 Voicemail number

Enter the number for your voicemail.

You will find this number in the documents supplied by your network provider.

Press and hold the [1] key to listen to your voicemail.

8.6 Security settings

PIN: PIN request on/off, change PIN

Phone code: On/Off, change (factory preset code: 1234)

8.7 0000 to enter settings

Activate this safety mode to prevent changes being made to settings unintentionally.

8.8 Master reset

You can restore all the factory settings on your phone (factory preset phone code: 1234).

9. EMPORIA EMERGENCY CALL FUNCTION

Read the instructions carefully and set the emergency function according to your needs. You can save up to five emergency contacts (family members, friends and official institutions).

- In an emergency, press and hold the emergency button on the back of the phone.
- The five preset numbers will be dialled automatically in the order in which you have saved them. If it is not possible to get through to anyone on the first number, the second number will automatically be dialled. If it is not possible to get through to anyone on the second number, the third number will automatically be dialled, and so on. (The phone will go through a list of five numbers a maximum of three times.)
- At the same time as each emergency call, a text message (SMS) will be sent to the contact, saying:
 - »You are about to receive an emergency call that will be ended after 1 minute. Return the call immediately. Your call will automatically be answered.«
- The emergency call will automatically be ended after 1 minute.

 This prevents the emergency call from going through to a contact's voicemail or answerphone. and it is for this reason that the recipient of the emergency call has to call back the person who made the emergency call. The person's emporia phone will then automatically answer this call in hands-free mode.

- From the moment you make an emergency call, your emporia
 phone will automatically answer any incoming calls for one
 hour. To disable this function, press and hold the red key for
 approx. 3 seconds or turn your device off completely using the
 key and then turn it on again.
- To cancel an emergency call, press and hold the red key.
- During the emergency call, a warning tone will sound continuously to alert anyone nearby and the person being called.
- If you do not have any emergency contacts saved, have no credit on your prepaid phone card or are connected to another network without permission (e.g. roaming is not activated),
 112 will be dialled when you press the emergency button.
- If you want to add the number of an official institution such as the police or fire brigade as an emergency contact, you must check that this is okay with the respective institution beforehand. Emporia does not assume liability for any costs incurred through you calling such an institution by mistake.

> Adding/editing emergency contacts

In the **Settings** menu ⇒ **Emergency contacts**

- ⇒ Add emergency contact
- ⇒ Select an entry (e.g. **Emergency contact 1)** using the arrow keys, and .
- ⇒ Select **Ok** by pressing the green **(** key.
- ⇒ Select **Private** or **Help organisation** by pressing the green **(** key.
- ⇒ Select a contact.

> Enabling the emergency button

In the Settings menu

- ⇒ Emergency contacts
- ⇒ Emergency button
- ⇒ On/Off

> Pre-alarm

The pre-alarm is a warning tone that sounds for 10 seconds and alerts anyone nearby to the emergency call.

After this, the emergency call sequence starts.

In the Settings menu,

- ⇒ Emergency contacts
- ⇒ Pre-alarm
- ⇒ On/Off


> Intended use
